

# DECLARATION OF THE MAYORS FROM MAYORS FORUM IN GENEVA

April 5th 2022

We, the Mayors of European cities, gathered at UNECE conference in Geneva to share our experience on how we can make our cities better places to live.

We, the mayors, declare that the Russian invasion of Ukraine, however, is the single most important topic for Europe and all the free world.

As no city can prosper being under attacks, we, the mayors:

- demand Russia and Belarus to stop aggression immediately;
- ask all the international institutions, including UN, and all the states to use all their powers to stop Russian invasion of Ukraine;
- invite all international institutions, states and cities to contribute to the rebuilding of Ukrainian cities;
- we, the mayors, are committed to support Ukrainian civil society and municipalities in crisis management, post-war reconstruction and reconciliation. We are actors of peace. Our cities are engaged next to governments, NGOs and citizens to provide help, welcome war refugees from Ukraine.

We, the mayors of free cities, stand united with Ukraine.
